BOYCE HISTORICAL TIDBITS Actions by the first Town Council 3/18/1918 Mr Mark F Reid of Front Royal appeared before the Council in regard to a concrete sidewalk from White Post Road tto a point opposite the High School. The Council favored contracting with Mr. Reid for 820 feet of pavement at a cost of \$1.30 per square yard of pavement and curb and gutter of 20 cents per foot, if desired. The sum of Thirty-five dollars was appropriated for the improvement of Whiting Avenue from the 3/25/1918 Turnpike to the top of the hill. 5/20/1918 Chairman Committee on Streets, Grounds, and Buildings was authorized and directed to cause to be purchased and installed a new pump for and in the public well. 6/3/1918 Be it enacted that it shall be unlawful to use the cut-outs on any automobile subject to a fine of from \$2.50 to \$10.00 after on notification. 7/1/1918 It is hereby certified that the no. of electors at this election amount to twenty-six (26). JT Sprint 25 votes for mayor. C Van Deventer, M J Dunlap, J C Hook, H J Martin, and P T Grim were elected to the Town Council.
