## **BOYCE HISTORICAL TIDBITS**

#### Actions by the first Town Council

Special Meeting called by the Mayor 8/23/1923

CONTINUED FROM NOVEMBER NEWSLETTER Whereas, The route requested herein will give that rich agricultural section a direct route to Berryville, and easy access to the evaporators and barrel factories at both Boyce and Berryville, while this route would give the tourist continuous proximity to the Shenandoah River and it's famous camping sites, while both farmer and tourist would have easy access to Winchester by it's crossing the Lee-Jackson Highway at Boyce.

Wherefore, The Council of the Town of Boyce in conjunction with citizens of the County, request that the section of said route No 7 be changed so as to run from said Double Toll Gates to White Post, throught the Town of Boyce and via Old Chapel to Berryville, along which route limestone rock is at hand, and several hundred perches of which are already ricked along the route, ready for the crusher.

10/8/1923 Special Meeting called by the Mayor

The following petition was filed and on motion the prayer thereof was granted.

We the undersigned voters, and citizens of the Town of Boyce, VA, respectfully petition that you amend your ordinance in relation to the prohibition of the sale of fire-crackers within the said Town so that the merchants may sell items and the purchasers be under the restrictions of first ordinance assed forbidding them to fire same within one hundred feet of the public streets.

The effect of the present ordinance is to force everyone who want to buy them, even the ones who want to use them in the country, to go to some other town to buy them and while there buy their other holiday goods to the detriment of the Boye merchants and also the town itself.

Signed by 32 Town Residents.
